

Police Release Chase Footage Of FW Slaying Suspect

Man Accused In Woman's Death; Body Never Found

FORT WORTH, Texas -- Police have released video of the high-speed chase and arrest of a man accused in the death of a [Fort Worth](#) woman.

Fort Worth officers were pursuing [Rodney Eugene Owens](#) in October 2007 in connection with the carjacking of a [Dallas](#) woman.

Footage from the officers' dashboard camera show the chase weaving in and out of traffic and over medians before ending on the bridge where westbound Interstate 20 turns onto northbound Interstate 35.

Owens was charged in connection with carjacking the vehicle he was driving during the pursuit.

Police also quickly linked him to the death of [Glenda Furch](#), his one-time neighbor who worked at the General Motors plant in Arlington.

Her body has never been found.

"We've already accepted the fact that something bad has happened to my mom," [Shimon Furch](#) said. "So at this point, we can't do anything other than try to put her to rest better than what she is."

Police said there is no doubt Furch is dead, based on blood evidence found in her east Fort Worth apartment soon after she disappeared in September 2007.

Since Owens was arrested after the high-speed chase a month later, police said he has not revealed what he did with her body.

Glenda Furch's family said they just want to know where her body is, so they can give her a proper burial.

"At some point, he'll find it in his best interest to say something, because it's not going to look good for him at the end," Shimon Furch said.

Owens has not gone to trial in connection with Glenda Furch's slaying.
